The conference is dedicated to the Centennial of the First Lithuanian Pharmacy Diploma.

One hundred years ago, the first nine graduates of the University of Lithuania completed their higher pharmacy studies and were awarded the diploma of Chemist-Pharmacist.

Over the past 100 years, approximately 5,600 individuals have completed higher pharmacy studies in Kaunas. These graduates are not only the creators of Lithuanian pharmacy history but also contributors to the broader history of our country. As we mark this centennial milestone, it is a fitting moment to look back and reflect on the remarkable journey we have taken.

The International conference “Contemporary Pharmacy: Issues, Challenges and Expectations 2025” is focused on the novelties of pharmacy science and practice in response to contemporary challenges within the historical background. It will bring together scientists, pharmacists, and other healthcare workers, providing the international research community in research and learning with an opportunity to present, discuss and publish recent research results and approaches to develop new ideas and collaborations.

The conference program will feature special thematic sessions for pharmacy professionals and scientists. Young scientists and students’ presentations will be competing for the Best Presentation Award.

All submitted abstracts will pass through a peer-review process and will be published in the abstract book.

The abstract in MS Word format is limited to 300 words count with no artwork and /or table. Max 250 words with only one artwork and /or table are allowed, artwork and table should be inserted into the text in the appropriate place. Text, artwork/table, and references must be on one page.

Artwork could be inserted using the commands Paste Special/Picture (Windows Metafile) or Insert picture/From file. Each of them should be clearly identified with a caption and its number. Fig 1., Table 1. Table text size is 10 pt.

Instructions for preparing poster:

For the poster use A1 format. The poster must be of a vertical (portrait) design. The poster must be in English.

In the poster you should include:

- Title (with names of authors and affiliations);
- Background;
- Methods;
- Results;
- Conclusion;
- References.

Use both UPPER and lower case letters for general content, as the all-capital text is difficult to read. Do not use more than 2-3 fonts and 3-4 text sizes, our recommendations for the font sizes:

- Title – 100 pt bold sans-serif or Garamond font;
- Section Heading – 40-48 pt bold sans-serif or Arial font;
- Body Text – 26-32 pt sans-serif or Arial font;
- Captions – 26-32 pt sans-serif or Arial font.

Make sure there is enough contrast between the color of the text and the poster's background. Choose a simple color scheme with only two or three related colors. Change colors on graphs and figures in a way that complements the background color. A light background and black letters are the best combinations and the easiest to read.

Make sure ideas flow logically from one section to the next. Use charts and graphs to illustrate data (avoid raw data and large tables, but if you must include them, keep them simple). Each illustration should be self-descriptive (everything that is depicted in images or graphs must be named).
